
What is guardianship/conservatorship?

- Relationship created by state law
- Court gives one person/entity the duty and power to make personal/property decisions for another upon a finding the individual is not able to do so.
- Majority of states call it guardianship while a handful refer it as conservatorship

#### Who are the Guardians/ Conservators?

#### The court can appoint:

- Family members
- Willing friends
- Trained volunteers
- Professionals such as lawyers/professional guardians
- Corporate or governmental agencies-banks, private agencies



Who is subject to guardianship/conservatorship?

- Aging adults who have lost or partially lost the ability to make decisions due to dementia or other cognitive impairment
- Younger individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities
- Individuals with mental illness, brain injury or substance abuse

What kinds of decisions do guardians/conservators make?

Depending on type of Guardianship/Conservatorship granted by the court:

- Health care
- Personal decisions (even relationships)
- Residential decisions
- Financial decision
- The court can limit guardianships/conservatorships rights

What is a "Fiduciary Duty"?

- Manages money, property, and financial investments for someone else.
- Must build and have high level of trust, confidentiality, accountability.
- Must act without conflict of interest or appearance of conflict.
- Guardians and conservators are fiduciaries.

Why is Guardianship/ Conservatorship supposed to be "a last resort"?

- Guardianships/conservatorships drastically erodes self determination, choice, and personal rights
- Double edged sword; constant, inherent tension
- Takes away fundamental rights such as:
  - Right to contract
  - Right to marry
  - Right to control and manage assets
  - Medical decision making
  - Residential choices
  - Right to vote
- Courts are supposed to seek/consider less restrictive options, but 99.99% of the time this does NOT happen!

#### Challenges with the Guardianship/ Conservatorship System

- Not One Guardianship/Conservatorship System but 51 Different Systems!!!
  - Differing Terminology, Requirements, Practices
- Inconsistent Court Oversight of Guardianship & Conservatorship Cases
- In most states guardian submit annual report & accounting to court – but who oversees this?
- Families and dependent adults are at the mercy of the Judge and court system

#### How Guardianships/ Conservatorships become Source of Abuse

- Some guardians take advantage of appointment
- Breach of fiduciary duties
- Misuse income or assets for own purposes
- Abuse or neglect person
- Isolate from family and friends

  Direct violation of Rights to Visitation,
  Communication and Interaction (link to 2018)
  Legislative Fact Sheet by ABA Commission on Law & Aging)
- Exert undue influence and control
- Force unnecessary medications to manage and control vulnerable dependent adults under the color of law

#### Why Do We Know So Little About Abuse in Guardianship?

- Scant data & transparency issues: courts lack staff & technology to track
- Reports & accountings may not be filed
- Courts (APS, attorneys, court reporters, law enforcement) lack training
- Case considered "closed"
- State & local practices vary
- Extent of court-APS-law enforcement interaction on possible abuse cases unknown
- Little coordination between state courts and SSA rep payee system



"'Alternatives..." implies that guardianship is the default approach, and that anything else is a special case. It gives credibility to guardianship.

Ending a guardianship is known as "Restoration of Rights." That means we should be eliminating the term "Guardianship" and using the correct terminology which is "Removal of Rights." It's not about granting a relative/professional authority to help a person, but mostly about taking away rights.

And the terminology grants guardianship recognition as the primary or default choice.

The question we should talk about is "how do we support this individual?" Not, "when do we remove his/her rights?"

We can no longer ignore the great incongruity of removing a person's rights to protect them."




#### From Pyramid to Pillar: A Century of Change

Population of the United States





According to the U.S. Census Bureau, there were 40.3 million U.S. residents 65 years and older in the 2010 Census and more than 54 million on July 1, 2019.

#### Request for Legislative Action & Justice

- Coordinated Oversight between Federal & State Court Rulings regarding guardianship/conservatorship and protection of rights of the ward/conservatee and families/whistleblowers
- Alternative to guardianships/conservatorships as first choice
- Reform & investigation of financial abuse, exploitation, and isolation of aging adults and dependent adults with disabilities
- Preserving the rights of the individual and reuniting with families for those who have been taken by the system
- Update Legislative Policies & Oversight
  - End isolation & abuse
  - Support person-centered plans
  - Respect Self-Determination & Supported Decision Making
- Seek a congressional recommendation to the President that he make an Executive Order asking the US DOJ to prioritize investigations of abuse of dependent adults' rights by courts as RICO/Public Corruption, and clarifying the definition of the limit of how a state may not remove constitutional rights but must instead seek different solutions.

- 10. The names of the real estate each professional guardian has used.
- 11. How often do probate investigators visit the wards and what is the amount of time in between visits?
